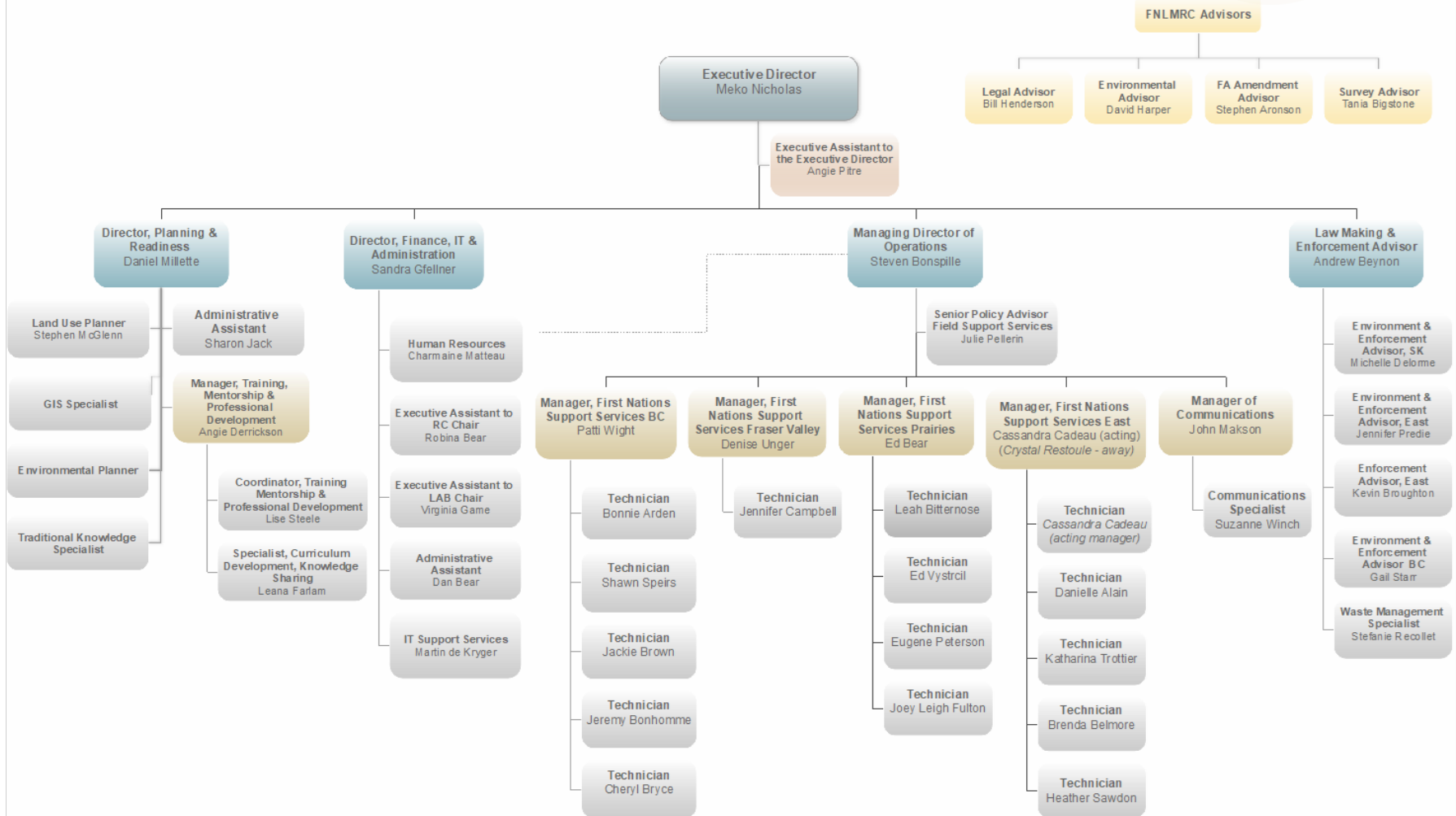


# LAB/RC Business Strategy to 2023 Overview - Continued
